Brihony Dawson

Brihony (they/them) is a rare entertainment force and has proven themselves a sought-after MC and presenter in the queer, corporate and sporting spheres as well as social and television. Brihony was part of the hosting team for the ABC's World Pride coverage in 2023, was the first non-binary tv host on a major network in Australia and has done the rounds as a vocalist at Mardi Gras, Midsumma, Life Ball, Vienna Pride, and other major pride events across the globe.

ENTERTAINMENT



Hayden Dun

Hayden is a classically trained pianist who performs within a wide variety of styles including classical, contemporary, rock, pop, theatre, folk and jazz.

Hayden's experience includes performing at weddings, retirement villages, bars, on radio stations including North West FM and 103.5FM, as well as in musicals such as Sri Lankan Fireteam - The Power Of Song. He has also worked as a pianist for The Australian Ballet classes, and is a long-standing member of Impromptunes, an improvised musical comedy troupe.



MzRizk

Pioneering Lebanese Australian DJ, radio presenter, live performer and percussionist, MzRizk is a self-taught creative chameleon. She has travelled the world with her music, playing Glastonbury twice alongside festivals in Beirut, New York, Tilburg and Croatia, and has opened for numerous internationally acclaimed artists.

Closer to home she has DJ'd City of Melbourne's NYE celebrations for five consecutive years, as well as numerous other major events including NGV Friday Nights, MIFF, the Australian Open, WOMADelaide, Biennale of Sydney, and more.



Adam Noviello & Friends

Adam (they/them) is a genderqueer singer-songwriter based in Naarm. Described by Mama Alto as "The long lost love child of Troye Sivan and Lady Gaga", Adam has made quite the splash on the music scene since their debut in early 2022.

Adam's debut single, HERETIC, wowed audiences and hit #1 on the Australian iTunes Dance Chart in January 2022 and #5 on the Australian Independent Record Labels Association singles chart.

Tonight's performance features several talented local performers, choreographed by Christopher Politis.



Melbourne Gay & Lesbian Chorus

The Melbourne Gay & Lesbian Chorus (MGLC) is an award-winning choir with a commitment to camaraderie through music. Celebrating 34 years of advocacy for equality, they are Australia's longest running LGBTIQA+ choir, whose members have challenged stereotypes and stood as proud role models in the community since 1990. Led by Musical Director, Stephanie Teh, MGLC is a wholly inclusive choir that's proud to champion diversity and foster acceptance in the LGBTIQA+ community.



Zoë Badwi

Zoë burst on to the scene in 2008 with the club smash 'Release Me', which spent 7 consecutive weeks at #1 in the Australian ARIA Club Chart and scored ARIA and APRA nominations.

In 2010 her hit 'Freefallin' stormed to the top 10 ARIA singles chart, becoming the #6 most played track in the country.

Zoë created 'Torches' to become the Official Anthem of the 2014 Sydney Mardi Gras, and has continued to perform, write, feature on, and release numerous dance anthems.



Sheldon Riley

Known for his entrancing vocals and avant-garde style, Sheldon Riley has firmly established himself as a name to remember.

He made a powerful impact at the 2022 Eurovision Song Contest as a Grand Finalist and has received international acclaim for his unique sound and electrifying performances on "The Masked Singer" and most recently "America's Got Talent - All Stars", where he stunned audiences around the world

Sheldon is currently focused on his eagerly awaited debut album and upcoming European and US shows.

AWARD CATEGORIES



IMPROVING HEALTH AND WELLBEING

This award recognises organisations or individuals who run health and wellbeing initiatives or programs that improve the health of Victorian I GRTIOA+ communities

FINALISTS

LGBTIQA+ Women's Health Conference presented by Thorne Harbour Health focuses on health and wellbeing needs of Australian LGBTIQA+ women. The only one of its kind in Australia, it aims to create safer spaces to strengthen the health and wellbeing of all LGBTIQA+ women, including Aboriginal women and Sistergirls, women of colour, women with disabilities, trans, gender diverse and intersex women.

Michelle Thompson (she/her) is CEO at Family Access Network, which is the first homelessness service in Victoria to receive Rainbow Tick accreditation, demonstrating their ability to understand the needs and provide culturally appropriate support to LGBTIQA+ young people experiencing homelessness. Supporting young LGBTIQA+ homeless people since 2006, they're the first organisation in Victoria to have a LGBTIQA+ youth homelessness response.

WayOut Sunbury (Sunbury and Cobaw Community Health) promotes the rights, mental health and wellbeing of LGBTIQA+ young people. WayOut delivers social support groups, intergenerational community events and education to build capacity of local organisations, businesses and community groups to provide opportunities for meaningful social connection for LGBTIQA+ young people in Sunbury as a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.



PREVENTING SOCIAL ISOLATION

This award recognises organisations – including corporates, community and social groups – who run programs or initiatives that reduce social isolation and build connections within Victorian LGBTIQA+ communities.

FINALISTS

Birds of a Feather is an initiative of the country LGBTIQA+ Inclusion Program, a program of Sunbury and Cobaw Community Health. It provides opportunities for LGBTIQA+ adults to expand their social networks and build a sense of belonging. It's a place to connect and be inspired through hearing shared LGBTIQA+ stories via keynote talks, panel discussions and musical performances.

Minus 18 is Australia's largest charity for LGBTIQA+ youth. For 25 years, Minus18 has created life-affirming events, delivered free education and driven inclusion campaigns across Australia. Minus18's Queer Youth Connect Program has reached more than 74,000 LGBTIQA+ young people across Australia since 2011 and is a beacon for social inclusion.

Queer Social by Laneway Learning is an ongoing event that combines social connection, learning and creativity, for queers by queers. Since 2021, thousands of attendees have been mingling while learning together about pottery, money management, sex, car mechanics, macrame, sewing and more. Proven benefits of community learning include improved mental health, life satisfaction and decreased social isolation.



OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO SPORT

This award recognises Victorian LGBTIQA+ individuals, groups or organisations that have excelled in their sporting pursuits both in and beyond the sporting arena, or who have driven LGBTIQA+ inclusion in sport and physical activity.

FINALISTS

Kade Matthews (he/him) is Proud 2 Play's Community Engagement Officer, leading initiatives to promote LGBTQI+ inclusion in sports, creating inclusive environments and advocating for diversity. His work has significantly increased participation and improved the wellbeing of LGBTQI+ individuals in sports communities, making a lasting impact on promoting equality and fostering a sense of belonging among diverse athletes and participants.

Mount Alexander Falcons is a country sporting club built by and for women and gender diverse people, reimagining how people who have experienced marginalisation can access not only sport but belonging and connection. They continue to push boundaries and visibility of women and gender diverse people in sport, through means such as the international feature length documentary film 'Equal the Contest'.

Queer Sporting Alliance (QSA) delivers community sport to the LGBTIQA+ community and their allies. Over eight years QSA has grown from six friends playing basketball in Coburg to the world's premier LGBTIQA+ community sporting club. Supported by major sponsor Champion, QSA created Q League to build spaces for transgender and gender diverse people to enjoy sport alongside their ally mates.



OUTSTANDING ADVOCACY

This award recognises organisations that run advocacy or social change campaigns - using systems, processes or programs - that shift attitudes, beliefs and behaviours for the benefit of Victorian LGBTIQA+ communities.

FINALISTS

Gippsland Pride Initiative Inc. is a grassroots community-led charitable association by and for LGBTIQA+ Gippslanders. From local intimate accessible events to resource development, research and training, the Gippsland Pride Initiative Inc. is responsible for the benchmark 2023 Rainbow Brick Road Report, an annual pride gala event, and delivering more than 30 events across six shires and 40,000 kms each year.

Keolis Downer Yarra Trams is the proud operator of Yarra Trams, where they strive to create a safe and welcoming network for all Victorians. In 2021, Yarra Trams delivered their first #AllAboard campaign, featuring the Rainbow Tram, a giant moving message of equality and inclusion on a Melbourne icon. This campaign has since evolved to feature artwork from LGBTIQA+ artists.

Tiny Pride and Winters Consulting created the Policing and the Rainbow Community Forum in October 2023. Funded by the Empowering Communities Grant (Department of Justice and Community Safety and City of Ballarat), the forum was the culmination of the vision of several Ballarat LGBTIQA+ community members and allies, within and outside of Victoria Police, to form a more constructive relationship.



OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO MEDIA

This award recognises individuals or organisations who have delivered an exceptional piece of reporting, podcasts or other media activity that celebrates Victorian LGBTIQA+ communities, or that sheds light on current LGBTIQA+ issues.

FINALISTS

Archer Magazine is a print and digital publication that platforms voices, artwork and experiences from the intersections of LGBTIQA+ communities, with each magazine issue being based on a different theme. Supported by Drummond Street Services, and celebrating its 10th birthday in 2023, Archer Magazine has been sold in 11 countries worldwide, received many awards, and amassed 3 million website views.

Carolyn Cage (she/her) is a documentary filmmaker known for contributions to LGBTIQA+ storytelling, including ABC's landmark series 'Queerstralia' and We Are Pride's first original production 'My First Time'. She uses her work as a vehicle to promote acceptance and understanding, amplify diverse voices, and as a driving force for cultural change where queer stories aren't just acknowledged but celebrated.

Well Well well is JOY 94.9's weekly radio show and podcast exploring the health and wellbeing of our LGBTIQA+ communities and people living with HIV. Presented by the team from Thorne Harbour Health including Cal Hawk, Jacinta Hennekam, Michael Whelan, Rachel Cook and Jack Crnjanin, Well Well Well has broadcast more than 900 episodes over 18 years.



EXCELLENCE IN SMALL BUSINESS

This award recognises outstanding achievement in business by LGBTIQA-owned small businesses (with fewer than 100 employees) operating in Victoria. The aim of this category is to highlight the contribution that is made by LGBTIQA-owned small businesses to their community.

FINALISTS

Amor Sensory is a small trans and disabled owned business founded by Andy Amor. In 2021 they launched Australia's first chest binder range, claiming the world's first sensory-friendly and size-inclusive chest binders, demonstrating their dedication, innovation and unwavering support for the trans and gender-diverse community. Their work has empowered countless individuals to find joy, comfort and confidence in their bodies.

The Laird Hotel is powered by publicans Brett Lasham and Mark Carney. Their roles in running The Laird cover everything from the usual 'pub' type things, to creating events with community organisations, sporting groups and bear, leather and rubber communities.

Your Key Advocacy is a property buyers advocate helping people navigate the Melbourne property market. They have introduced a 'queer property night' for first home buyers who are nervous or need help, and deliver a wonderful experience for all clients by creating a trusted queer cocoon that helps rainbow clients navigate this often hetero-normative and alpha industry.



WORKPLACE INCLUSION PRESENTED BY LIBERTY FINANCIAL

This award recognises Victorian businesses that champion equity and inclusion for all LGBTIQA+ people in their workplace.

FINALISTS

Aussie Broadband is the fourth largest provider of NBN services across Australia. They are big believers that staff should be able to bring their whole, authentic selves to work, and that what this looks like is different from person-to-person. They have many staff-led working groups including Inclusion & Diversity and The Pride Network.

Keolis Downer Yarra Trams is the proud operator of Yarra Trams, an icon of Melbourne. They are committed to creating safe and inclusive workplaces that advance equality and where employees are empowered to be their authentic selves. Through improved policies, education, network building and empowerment, and celebration, they have created a workforce where LGBTIQA+ employees can thrive.

Your Community Health has been helping people in Melbourne's north reach their health and wellbeing goals for 50 years, delivering services such as medical, dental, allied health, social support programs and COVID-19 response. Since 2020 they've increased employment of LGBTIQA+ staff from 8% to 28%, and 88% of staff say they can be themselves and feel culturally safe at work.



VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR PRESENTED

PRESENTED BY AUSSIE BROADBAND

This award recognises the work of a Victorian LGBTIQA+ individual who has shown outstanding commitment through volunteer work in our communities.

FINALISTS

Alison Black (she/her) has volunteered with Your Community Health for over 3 years, participating in several committees and project groups. A proud Aboriginal Sister-girl, Allison is Co-Chair of YCH's Kaydo Kertheba Working Group, which has been making important changes and taking great steps to better the lives of the Darebin indigenous community, while doing their part to reconcile Australia.

Bettina Handley (she/her) has been with Melbourne Frontrunners (MFR) since their humble beginnings 20 years ago. As a volunteer she's worked tirelessly to ensure MFR provides accessibility and inclusion for everyone in our community. An Athletics Victoria accredited coach, Bettina has been an MFR club coach for 6 years, recently holding the position of Head Coach for their 300+ members.

Cheryl Szöllősi (she/her) is an active volunteer in the Ballarat LGBTIQA community, running Uncoordinated Queers and weekly Rainbow Ballarat Coffee meetups for people of all ages who might otherwise be isolated, to create opportunities for people to come together and make new friends. Cheryl also volunteers with LaNCETV as a video camera operator, filming their weekly show for Ch31 and Facebook.



OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO THE ARTS

This award recognises Victorian LGBTIQA individuals or groups who celebrate LGBTIQA+ communities through their artistic pursuits.


FINALISTS

Drew Pettifer (he/him) is a queer artist, educator and volunteer who creates radical, immersive encounters with hidden queer histories through art. His recent artworks in Queer and Melbourne Now (both NGV) shared under-represented queer narratives with over one million visitors. Drew also regularly delivers free workshops with queer and minority artists working with critical histories in their creative practices.

Gender Euphoria is a trans cabaret phenomenon co-created by Mama Alto and Maude Davey. A celebration of queer voices that features the largest all-trans and gender-diverse ensemble to perform in an Australian main stage context, Gender Euphoria platforms a rich mosaic of joy, beauty, love, power, and euphoria trans cabaret.

Kitty Obsidian is a proud Wiradjuri/Gamilaroi, trans nonbinary person who is autistic and chronically ill. An independent artist and activist, Kitty is a teacher and mentor at Bottoms up dance school and works with the People of Cabaret mentoring young BIPOC artists and producers. Kitty's performance art breaks down barriers of intersectionality of marginalised people, challenging stereotypes and perspectives.





COMMUNITY CONTRIBUTION AWARD

This year the judging panel wanted to present a special recognition award to a member of our Victorian LGBTIQA+ community who sadly passed away before tonight's awards celebration

This award is being presented posthumously to a person who made a significant contribution through volunteering with numerous community organisations during their life. Tonight, we recognise and celebrate their achievements and their legacy of contribution to our community.

COMMUNITY INSPIRATION AWARD

PRESENTED BY GLOBE VICTORIA Chosen from among this year's finalists, the Community Inspiration Award recognises a Victorian LGBTIQA+ individual or organisation for the inspirational work they are doing to uplift and promote our Victorian LGBTIQA+ communities.

All of this year's finalists are considered and eligible to win this award, which celebrates someone who is making a significant impact to Victoria's LGBTIQA+ communities.

PERSON OF THE YEAR PRESENTED BY THE VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT

This award recognises a Victorian LGBTIQA+ individual who has led the way in driving inclusion and building capacity and connection between LGBTIQA+ and broader communities.

FINALISTS



Allison Winters (they/them) is a queer, non-binary, neurodiverse parent and the Executive Officer of LINE Wangaratta, a community-led charity focusing on social inclusion and celebration of LGBTIQA+ people in northeast Victoria. In 2023 Allison coordinated 88 free pride events in northeast Victoria, coordinated the Policing and the Rainbow Community project in Ballarat, and co-facilitated the Victorian LGBTIQA+ Leadership Program.
